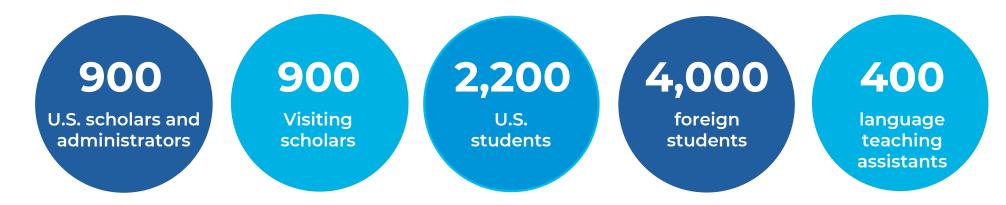

Eligibility for U.S. Scholar Program

🔾 🛛 U.S. citizenship

Degree and experience, as required by award:

- Ph.D. or other terminal degree
- MA and higher education teaching or professional experience
- Professional and/or artistic experience with substantial accomplishments
- Teaching experience as required

Compliance with <u>policies</u> on previous Fulbright Scholar awards: two year waiting period between Fulbright U.S. Scholar award and next application





Application Components

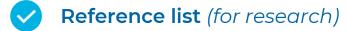
Requirements:

- Application Form
 - **Project Statement**
- Curriculum Vitae or Resume
- 2 Letters of Recommendation
- Language Proficiency Report (if required)



Supplemental Materials:

- - Course outlines or syllabi (for teaching)



Portfolio submissions (for artists, architects, and journalists)



Application Cycle

FEBRUARY	Competition Opens
SEPTEMBER 15	Application Deadline
SEPTEMBER	Program staff conducts technical reviews for completeness
OCTOBER – NOVEMBER	U.S. peer review
NOVEMBER – JANUARY	Applicants notified of status. Recommended applications are sent to host countries and to the Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board.
JANUARY – JUNE	Final decisions are made
JUNE – ONWARD	Participants prepare for departure

INTERVIEW: DR. GERMÁN ZÁRATE-SÁNDEZ

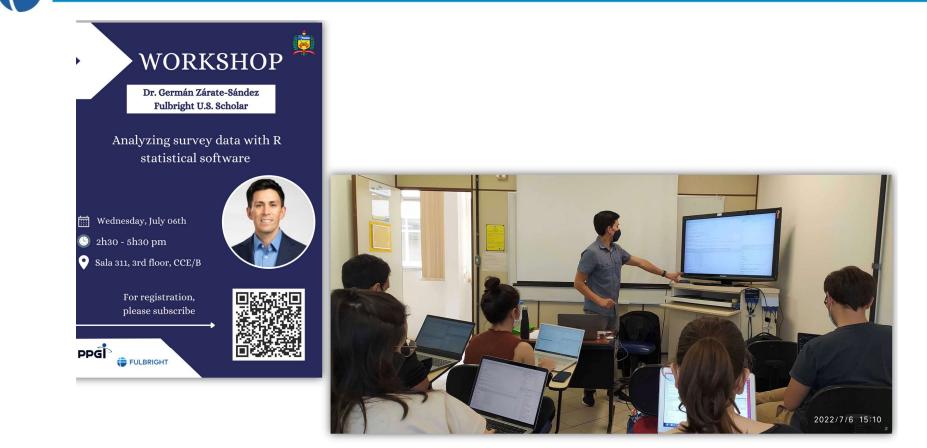
Germán Zárate-Sández is an Associate Professor of linguistics at Western Michigan University, USA, where he teaches courses in applied linguistics at the undergraduate aleviek, trains future teachers of Spanish as a second language, and directs the introductory Spanish language program. He is currently a Fubright U.S. Scholar at the Universidade Federal de Santa Catariana. His research focuses on the effectiveness of teaching methodologies, social justice issues in language learning, and the development of second language promotention. Zartate-Sández holds a Master's in English as a second language (University of Seranton, USA), a Master's in Spanish Linguistics (Goorgetown University, USA), and a Ph.D. in Applied Linguistics (Goorgetown University, USA).



Figure 1 is an old foundation funded by the U.S. government and it has many different types of grants. The scholarship I applied for is called US Fulbright Scholar and it is one of the most important grants they have. I applied in September 2020 but due to COVID-19, the process was delayed. There are some steps you must follow: documents you need to send, letters of recommendation and support (which I got from Professor Malice in Brazil), and after this phase, any application was sent to Fulbright in Brazil to be analyzed here. I was competing with 30 other projects from different areas of people who wanted to go to different places.
