#### Fulbright FLTA Program

- Brings early career educators to the U.S. to assist in language instruction and take courses for 1 academic year
- Professional development opportunity for the FLTA
- Benefits language programs and U.S. students
- FLTA Participants:
  - Can add a cross-cultural and international perspective to your institution's language curriculum
  - Can be utilized in a variety of roles









### The Typical FLTA Profile

- 30+ languages
- 50+ countries represented
- Eager cultural and language ambassadors
- Backgrounds in English language and English teaching
- Enthusiastic about exposure to teaching best practices and the U.S. academic environment







#### Benefits of Hosting

- FLTAs are dynamic representatives of the language and culture on campus and can:
  - Support existing language programs
  - Drive increased interest in a language
  - Assist in the development of new programs
- FLTAs work directly with students
- FLTAs are cultural ambassadors
- FLTAs participate in community engagement activities















#### Hosting an FLTA

- Open to all accredited post-secondary institutions
- Student interest in requested language
- Faculty and staff available to structure and support the FLTA's program
- A plan to provide mentorship and assist in logistics
- Ability to meet minimum financial support requirements







#### Program Requirements: Funding

- The Fulbright Program covers:
  - Roundtrip international airfare
  - J-1 visa compliant health benefits plan
- All host institutions must provide a tuition and fees waiver for two courses per semester, or one course per quarter/trimester
- Additional support level requirements differ for traditional and less commonly taught languages (LCTL)





#### Program Requirements: LCTLs vs. Traditional Languages

- Less Commonly Taught Languages
  - Additional funding beyond the course waiver is not required to apply. Recommended awards include:
    - An in-kind contribution of free housing or meal plan, or
    - A stipend to be used towards housing, food, and other costs
- Traditional Languages: French, German, Italian & Spanish
  - Host institutions should include an award for the FLTA's program expenses. Acceptable awards include:
    - A financial award great enough to cover room, board, and daily living expenses, or
    - Free room and board and a monthly stipend sufficient to cover living expenses

## Fulbright FLTA Timeline

October	Annual application for following academic year opens: <a href="https://apply.iie.org/fltahost2024">https://apply.iie.org/fltahost2024</a>
February	Application closes in mid- to late-February
March-April	Institutions are selected to host FLTAs
April-May	FLTAs accept offers and are matched with host institutions
August-September	FLTAs arrive on campus
